ENO TRACE POOL RULES (Revised May 2023)

The pool opens at 6 AM and closes at 8:30 PM or dusk during the season. Any use of the pool outside of the published hours will be considered trespassing. Violators will be recorded by the digital I.R. cameras, lose their pool privileges for the season, and will be prosecuted.

There is not a lifeguard – swimming is at your own risk.

Do not prop open the gate, it is a violation of a Durham County Health Regulation to prop open/leave open the gate.

The pool is available to members in good standing only. Dues must be paid in full to have access to the pool. Architectural violations will also result in loss of pool privileges. If your card does not work, please contact Morgan's Property Management to regain access.

Pool monitors are the authority at this facility. If you disagree with any ruling made by the pool monitor, you may appeal it at the next board meeting (please call the management company for a date and time). Pending resolution at a board meeting the ruling will be upheld (no exceptions). Failure to follow the direction of the pool monitor may result in fines, suspension, and removal from the pool and/or police action.

- <u>NO GLASS</u> is permitted in the pool area. This is a Durham County Health Regulation. Should any glass be broken within the pool area, the pool will be closed and drained as mandated by law. Further, the member(s) responsible for the breakage will be assessed the full cost of repairing and refilling the pool.
- 2. No eating and drinking within 5 feet of the pool. No chewing gum is anywhere in the pool or on any park of the pool deck.
- 3. Appropriate swimming attire should be worn in the pool.
- 4. Member's children under the age of 16 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian over the age of 21 at all times.
- 5. Photo ID is required for entry to prove residency.

(Residents 16-20 may provide the following forms of identification: State ID, Driver's License or Learner's Permit, or School ID. If using a school ID and residency is not stated, then residency may be established by a parent or guardian's photo ID. Once residency is determined it will be recorded in the pool monitor's book for the season.)

- 6. A pool card is required for entrance. No exceptions. Members with valid pool cards are not permitted to open the gate for someone without a working/valid pool card.
- 7. Members and their guests must sign in with the pool monitor each visit.

- 8. Guests are permitted only when sponsored by a member in good standing. Members are responsible for their guests. Guests are obligated to abide by all pool rules.
 - a. Homeowners must accompany guest(s) at all times.
 - b. Members 16-20 are allowed one guest. No exceptions.
 - c. Members 21 and older are permitted up to 4 guests per household.
 - d. Homeowners that have their membership rights suspended or revoked, for any reason, may not be the guest of a member in good standing.
- Profane language, loud music, misbehavior, or actions resulting in and/or with the potential to cause property damage will not be tolerated. Any members (or their visitors) engaging in such activity will be asked to leave the pool and the member's pool privileges may be suspended.
- 10. Running, pushing, dunking, and diving are not allowed.
- 11. Bicycles, skateboards, skates, and animals are strictly forbidden in the pool area.
- 12. No smoking or vaping in the pool area.
- 13. Use of the pool for parties is prohibited.
- 14. Everyone must rinse off under the shower prior to entering the pool.
- 15. Any person with an infection, skin abrasion, inflamed eyes, wearing bandages, or having a cold or cough may be denied use of the pool or asked to leave.
- 16. All incontinent swimmers should wear a swim diaper or rubber pants, and a swimsuit in the pool.
- 17.. Trash and recyclables should be placed in the proper containers.
- 18. No one should swim alone.
- 19. No one under the influence of drugs or alcohol is allowed in the pool or pool area.
